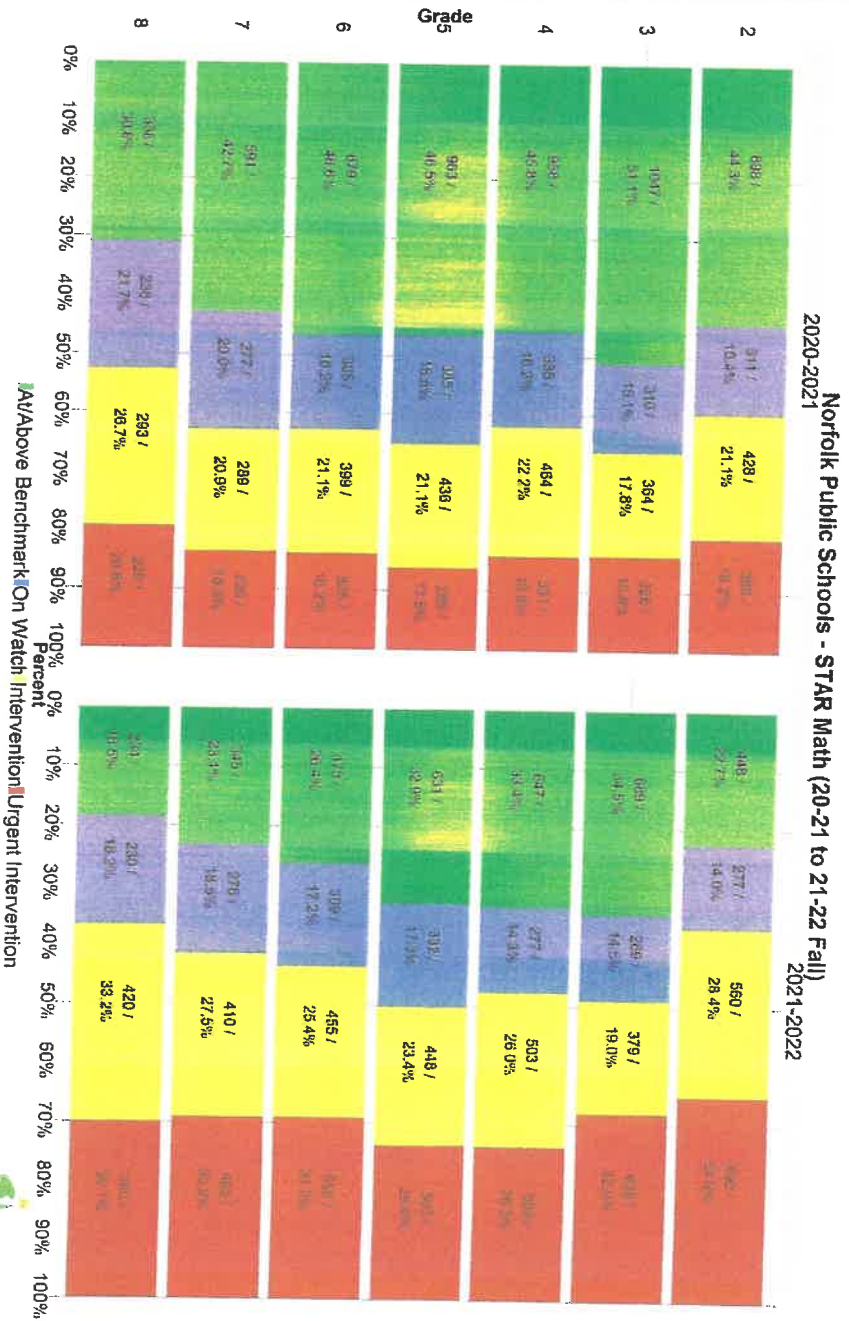

Implications & Next Steps - Reading

Level	Next Steps
At/Above Benchmark	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Lexia provides enrichment for students reading at or above grade level to provide appropriate academic rigor. Achieve3000 texts are adjusted to student reading level to build confidence, but may be adjusted up to 1380 Lexile to challenge them as well. Teachers assist students with appropriate selection of reading materials from classroom and online libraries.
On Watch	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Utilize stations/centers approach in ELA classroom to include Lexia program use, teacher-led small group instruction, and independent practice application of skills. Spiraling review of "YDOE Essentials" SOL strands in ELA classrooms. Develop aligned, targeted tier one instruction and explicit modeling of active reading skills and annotation. Lexia <i>lessons</i> and <i>comprehension passages</i> resources support tier one instruction in ELA classroom.
Intervention	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide supplemental small group instruction focusing on systematic phonics with groups implemented by PALS Early Literacy Tutors. Lexia <i>lessons</i>, <i>comprehension passages</i>, and <i>skill builders</i> resources support small group teaching and learning in ELA, reading support, and resource classrooms. Specially Designed Instruction in whole group, small group, and 1:1 settings based on data. Reference STAR <i>Instructional Planning-Student Report</i> to customize and scaffold instruction in small group and 1:1 settings.
Urgent Intervention	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provide supplemental small group instruction focusing on systematic phonics with groups implemented by PALS Early Literacy Tutors. Implement SAVVAS ILit program in ELA 6-8 reading support classes. Additional support in reading support classes with tutors. Reference STAR <i>Instructional Planning-Student Report</i> to customize and scaffold instruction in small group and 1:1 settings. Provide ongoing support and professional development for tutors in elementary and middle school placements.
